Musical Terms

Tempo- The speed a piece of music is played.

Largo- slowly

Adagio- slowly

Andante- walking speed

Moderato-moderate tempo

Allegro- fast

Vivace- lively

Accelerando- gradually getting faster. Usually abbreviated as *accel.*

Ritardando- gradually getting slower. Usually abbreviated as *rit.*

a tempo- return to the original tempo.

Dynamics- How loud or soft a note is played or sung.

Pianissimo- very softly, **pp**

Piano- soft, **p**

Mezzo piano- moderately soft, **mp**

Mezzo forte- moderately loud, **mf**

Forte- loud, **f**

Fortissimo- very loud, **ff**

Crescendo- gradually getting louder, abbreviated *cresc.*

Decrescendo- gradually getting softer, abbreviated *decresc.*

Articulation- The style a note is played or sung.

Staccato- detached or separated. usually notated with a .

Legato- smooth and connected. usually notated with a -
